1. Introduction:

Since antiquity, society has detected disabilities arising out of obvious deficits in anatomical structures, sensory functions and intellectual developments amongst its members. These disabilities debarred the affected persons from participating in the mainstream of social life. There are 600 million persons with disabilities in the world today. 80% of them live in developing countries. A staggering 90 million people in India are disabled. That's almost one in every ten. This number illustrate that still 600 million persons with disabilities are being prevented from contributing to the world society (whether socially or economically) because of the barrier called disability.

However, there has been a shift in international thinking on disability from largesse-based perspective to rights-based perspective. The world for and of the disabled is changing at a rapid pace and the aspirations as well as expectations of people are also changing as fast. Advances in medical and surgical sciences, breakthroughs in technology, greater understanding of the causes of disability and improved methods of coping with it, increasing consciousness of civil rights and the emergence of people with disabilities displaying skills and knowledge to improve their own lives, are some of the factors which have contributed to the new thinking. It is now recognized that the disabled deserve a dignified status in society on the same terms as the non-disabled. Disabled people are a vast minority group, which has been subjected to direct and indirect discrimination for centuries in most countries of the world, including India.

The human rights movement has boldly and categorically shifted the attention of policy-makers from the mere provision of charitable services to vigorously protecting their basic right to dignity and self-respect. In the new scenario, the disabled are viewed as individuals with a wide range of abilities and each one of them willing and capable of utilizing his/her potential and talents. Society, on the other hand, is seen as the real cause of the misery of people with disabilities since it continues to put numerous barriers as expressed in education, employment, architecture, transport, health and other activities. However our parliament has enacted various legislations for the benefit and protection of disabled persons in India; let us briefly discuss these provisions.

2. Various Legislations and Position of Disabled Persons:

The Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971 specifically provides that pregnancies of women may be terminated if there is a substantial risk that if the child were born, it would suffer from such physical or mental abnormalities as to be seriously

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The Philosophy of Browning

The work of Robert Browning fully exemplifies one of the dominant tendencies of Victorian poetry, and probably the more important one because it comes nearer to expressing the originality of the period: the craving for analysis and moral criticism. Browning's art is entirely pervaded by intellectual curiosity and almost merged in the systematic quest of truth; it is parted from what is essential in pure science only by secondary intentions.

Browning recognized, however that he had gone too far. The work of his more mature years follows a middle course, without ceasing to be arduous and original. His object according to his own definition, is the study of incidents which go to compose the development of a soul .In his opinion there is little else that merits serious consideration.

Browning's typical form ,that towards which all the other forms may be said coverage ,is the monologue; there properly resides the newness of his art. His main idea is to throw light upon the realm of consciousness, and to do this he frees himself from all the shackles which impede psychological analysis, whether they are connected with action and synthesis and group together related elements. With unlimited profusion, he gives us the joy of understanding and reconstructing characters; he makes as appreciate, better then any other writer of his time ,the swarming variety of moral types. He vigorously emphasizes the dominant features and indicates detail with a minute understanding of the individual trait The same felicity of touch is to be found in his treatment of problems and theses. The work of Browning is without doubt one of the richest and the most deep reaching treatises in practical psychology that English literature has to offer.

To study things as they are, the very, end of scientific knowledge in the broad sense in which the novel may pretend to figure among its instruments. If Browning continued all his life to put into verse themes which in themselves scarcely seem to call for this choice, it was not by obedience to a discipline accepted at one time and then become habitual. In order to instill some vivacity and life into his psychological dissections, Browning required a language that was easy, energetic, humorous, familiar, or technical. The work of Browning written in his original and mixed forms which is neither prose nor verse often gives an impression of beauty but it is beauty of a spiritual and austere type, although human. He has, however, his actually inspired moods, when, under the spell of a more simple emotion, or of some striking symbol, powerful enough to call up and organize sounds and images, he reaches the heights of poetry, in the most precise sense of this term.

During his lifetime browning had conquered the indifference of the public, and by now he has ceased to be a bugbear in literature. He is widely read, indeed many of his poems have come to be looked upon as part of the general patrimony.

Browning has no formal message no church no philosophy,' in the technical issue .But he had definite and firm views on human life and human nature and of the relation of both to God. His philosophy of life was shaped as early as Pauline, and it remained unchanged up to the very end. His poetry is characterized by immense variety, but unity is

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Agricultural Products in Maharashtra

There are two important aspects to the marketing of agricultural products. The first has to do with the physical process that brings products from producers to consumers, the fundamental stages of this process are the collection, packaging, transport, processing, storage and lastly the retail sale of agricultural products. This first aspect shall be dealt with in detail in the pact sheet on post harvest management. The second aspect, which is addressed here, involves the market pricing mechanism.

Emphasis will therefore be placed on the market mechanism that contribute to the pricing of agricultural products and on the way the producers can obtain acceptable prices for their crops.

Understanding the pricing mechanism according to the law of demand & supply:-

When as is often the case in Africa a multitude of small farmers are faced with a limited number of buyers, it is hard for them to influence prices and they often just accept the price that is offered to them. Nevertheless, the situation has greatly evolved in African countries.

In Africa, for several decades, it was the state that set the price of agricultural products, especially cereal & export products. With the withdrawal of State funding and pravatistion, farmers have become increasingly exposed to the market and need guidance in their marketing activities.

Agricultural Marketing in Maharashtra:-

For a long period of time Indian agriculture was mostly in the nature of "Subsidence farming" The farmer sold only a small part of his produce to pay all rents, debts and meet his other requirements. Such sale was usually done immediately after harvesting of crops since there were no strong facilities. A considerable part of total produce was sold by the farmers to the village traders & moneylenders often of prices—considerably lower than the market prices. Therefore the government took some steps to improve the system of agricultural marketing.

The important steps are :-

- [i] Organisation of regulated markets.
- [ii] Grading and standardisation
- [iii] Use of standard weights
- [iv] Godown and storage facilities.
- [v] Dissemination of market information.

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Comparative of Depth Perception, Agility And Explosive Strength of Shoulder in Different Ball Games: A Study

Abstract: The main purpose of the study is to compare depth perception, agility and explosive strength of shoulder in different ball game players. A subject was selected from the inter-collegiate players. Age of subjects ranged between 18 to 28 years. The subject was selected from following games football, volleyball, handball only 15 male from each football, volleyball, handball intercollegiate players of different colleges were selected as subject. Simple random method was adopted for selection of the subject The collected data were analyzed by employing F-ratio statistical techniques to find out the significant difference between the selected three groups i.e. Football, Volleyball and Handball players in-depth perception, Agility and Shoulder strength. The finding of the study revealed that there is no significant differences in Depth perception (TabF0.05 (2, 42)= 3.219 > Cal F = 0.037) among the selected ball games. The finding of tables also reveals that there is significant difference in agility (Tab F0.05 (2, 42)= 3.219 < Cal F = 3.312) among the players i.e. significant difference found mean difference between Football and Volleyball players is 1.200 which is greater than critical difference0.949.Similarly, the finding of tables also reveals that there insignificant difference in Shoulder strength (Tab F0.05 (2, 42)= 3.219 < Cal F= 4.084) among the players i.e. significant difference found mean difference between Football-Handball (MD = 1.333) and Football-Volleyball (MD = 1.467) players are greater than critical difference1.145.

Qualified Instructors

The instructor should be thoroughly familiar with the rules, the possible causes of injuries, and be prepared to apply first aid, especially in reviving those who have been "choked out."He should emphasize that knowing how to fall (ukemi) is more important than knowing how to throw. In fact, falling is the first line of defense.

In the beginning, the novice must learn to fall in all directions forward, backward, and sideward. In India all qualified instructors are certified and registered with the Judo Federation of India or there related state association, District Association. Before a black belt instructor is hired, his credentials should be checked to avoid possible liability due to injuries. The instructor should emphasize the importance of:

I. Throwing Techniques

A. It is the responsibility of the thrower (tori) to tuck the sleeve of the uke (the one who is thrown) just before he lands so he will not hit his head and will land on his shoulder and side in the proper manner.

B. The thrower must not drive the uke into the mat; this will allow the uke to fall properly.

C. The thrower must not fall on the uke.

D. A throw should not be forced or completed when there is impending danger, such as when an opponent's foot is caught between the mats.

E. Certain types of throws (e.g., a wrapping hip throw) should not be used against individuals who have small, frail body structures.

II. Falling Techniques

A. The uke must break the habit of extending the hand or arm to brace him for the fall. The impact of the fall can cause fractures of the wrist, forearm, and dislocation of the elbow. The real danger is the additional force caused by the thrower (tori) falling on top of the uke.

B. The uke must learn to tuck in his shoulder and head so that the impact of the fall is distributed to his back and side rather than directly on the point of the shoulder.

The mother tongue as a cognitive and pedagogical resource will be more important for pupils of seven or eight upwards, by which time the mother tongue has taken firm root, and it will be more in evidence in the conventional classroom, where exposure to the FL is inevitably restricted, than in immersion situations. Using the mother tongue, we have (1) learnt to think, (2) learnt to communicate and (3) acquired an intuitive understanding of grammar. The mother tongue opens the door, not only to its own grammar, but to all grammars, inasmuch as it awakens the potential for universal grammar that lies within all of us. This foreknowledge is the result of interactions between a first language and our fundamental linguistic endowment, and is the foundation on which we build our Selves. It is the greatest asset people bring to the task of foreign language learning. For this reason, the mother tongue is the master key to foreign languages, the tool which gives us the fastest, surest, most precise, and most complete means of accessing a foreign language.

Teaching and learning of English language is a significant modern phenomenon which cannot be ignored. Teachers must take utmost care in acquiring all the skill of English language. The English teacher has a Herculean task to teach the foreign language in rural places. He has to seek aid of various traditional and modern methods to achieve the desired results.
